# **ORCID** Affiliation Manager

You may have seen in the recent ORCID member newsletter that they have announced a new tool called "Affiliation Manager". This is actually an adaptation of one small part of the NZ ORCID Hub, which ORCID have adapted for use by smaller ORCID member organisations. The ORCID Hub has much more functionality than this tool, with the ability to upload a range of other information to a user's ORCID record. #### ORCID restructure and new consortium contacts

ORCID has recently restructured from a regional set-up to one organised around their different types of members and stakeholders. The engagement team has been divided into three groups: Consortia, Direct Members, and Outreach and Partnerships. This means that Brian Minihan is no longer our contact at ORCID. # Highlights from the ORCID Annual Report

The ORCID Annual report was released on 11 March 2021, which gave good insight into the uptake and use of ORCID around the world. It noted that a recent OECD <u>survey</u> found that the ORCID iD is "the most widely used identification mechanism for researchers to assert online identity, eclipsing national identifiers and publisher author identifiers" and that "In the Higher Education and Government sectors, ORCID is the de facto standard: OECD reports that over 60% of researchers in each field reported using their ORCID iD as a digital identity in their research, and over 50% of researchers in each country reported using ORCID iDs." This is an encouraging reminder of the global position of ORCID. The full report can be found <u>here</u>.
