

Do you want to learn more about how to promote ORCID within your organisation? On **Thursday 12**th **October 2023** at **10am-11am** Royal Society Te Apārangi will be delivering an online Teams event focusing on how NZ ORCID consortium member organisations may approach or update their ORCID promotion plans. This online seminar will outline best practice for ORCID promotion within organisations, include a short presentation from University of Auckland about their plans for promoting and tracking ORCID use and offer a chance for member organisations to discuss with each other how they currently promote ORCID. Improvements to ORCID record interface

Following feedback from the ORCID community and the insights of the ORCID Researcher Advisory Council, ORCID Inc are now grouping Membership, Service, Invited Positions, and Distinctions into a new category called Professional Activities to display the professional activities of ORCID record holders more accurately. This change will only affect the user interface. Member integrators who are using the Member API will not need to make any changes to how they read and write the metadata in these fields. Royal Society Te Apārangi awards writing

Royal Society Te Apārangi have now completed a project to write awards information to the ORCID records of Royal Society Te Apārangi awards recipients. In total, 14 years of the Prime Minister's Science Prize awards and 13 years of Royal Society Te Apārangi awards have been written to records. More work will continue in order to add pre-2010 awards information to the ORCID records of active researchers. ORCID accessibility

ORCID have acknowledged that while there have been recent updates to the ORCID record interface and the interface is currently more accessible than ever, many ORCID record users continue to face barriers to building and maintaining their records. Increased financial commitment to ROR

ORCID has recently increased its financial commitment to the first openly available organisation identifier—Research Organization Registry (ROR). ROR IDs disambiguate institution names, capture affiliations, link affiliation metadata to research outputs, and exchange affiliation information across scholarly systems. If your organisation does not yet have a ROR ID then please contact <u>orcid@royalsociety.org.nz</u> and we can support you in applying for a free organisational ID. Record summary prototypes

In the final quarter of 2023, ORCID will pilot a new record summary prototype to make it easier for stakeholders to find and understand information within ORCID records. The record summaries will focus on the trust markers that can help to make decisions about the trustworthiness of an ORCID record. This new product will support ORCID member organisations in navigating the ORCID records of their researchers. Find out more about this product <u>here</u>.
