Consortium news

Let us know what information you would like to see in these newsletters, as their frequency will be driven by available content and, when needed, for updates in specific areas. Thanks to those of you who replied to our recent short survey, undertaken to provide information to the Advisory Committee for their meeting. Here is a [brief summary](#) of the results.

Advisory Committee

Monday 27th March saw the first meeting of the New Zealand ORCID consortium advisory committee. Laurel Haak, ORCID's chief executive joined us by videolink from the US and shared some slides on ORCID statistics, milestones reached in 2016 and goals for 2017. NZ ORCID Hub and the IT Advisory Group

The hub developers have been working hard to get the Hub up and running. The first launch aim is for Consortium members who are also Tuakiri-member organisations to be able to use the hub to assert affiliation for their researchers by the end of June 2017. After that, the developers will focus efforts on providing the same functionality for the Consortium's non-Tuakiri members.

There is a [dedicated space on our website](#) for resources dedicated to the hub's development. Those of you who are tech savvy will find the [JIRA board](#) and [Github](#) sites of interest; slightly less technical language is used in posts on the dedicated [Google group](#) which we urge you to join and use to interact with us.

Remember that there is an open demonstration of the hub's progress every second Thursday (upcoming 13 April and 27 April) at 2pm with the hub developer team at the University of Auckland. If you'd like to see the current state of the hub's development, exploration of new features, or ask questions, please feel free to drop in.

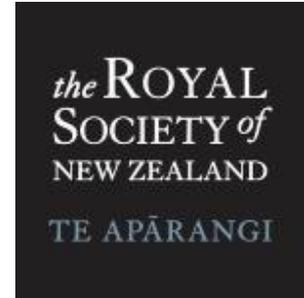
Let us know of any ORCID related news in your organisation that you'd like to share with the consortium – this can be anything from reaching ORCID milestones or sharing
